History of Our Yacht Racing Association T-Shirts

Due to the up and coming Yacht Racing Association (YRA) race on April 28-29, 2018, Barbara Brown, our ship store manager, is working again with Pirate's Lair for the 2018 race t-shirts. I found this

article from a past Binnacle that I had written about the race t-shirts.

"The annual YRA Race brings VYC the sales of the YRA t-shirts, sweatshirts and etc. Everyone has their own reason for buying the t-shirt. Here are a few reasons:

- First boat in wants crew to have memorabilia
- First time sailing in YRA Race wants each member of family to have one
- Proof of being here or racing in that particular year
- T-shirt given to you by a guy you met or vice versa
- Love the artistry
- Worked on a certain committee that year and the reasons go on and on....

When was the first YRA t-shirt sale?

After several years of handling the yachting apparel

for the club, Ginny Hargrace turned the job over to a committee consisting of Carmen Batchelor, Shirley Bunnell, Anna Van Dolson and myself. This was in 1985. The new committee was approached requesting, possibly sales of t-shirts for YRA. After many discussions we were given the go ahead and in May 1986 our first YRA t-shirts were made and sold. We were only allowed to order 100 t-shirts. The powersto-be were fearful they wouldn't sell. Wrong! To date, we have sold thousands of t-shirts, sweatshirts, caps and will continue in this endeavor. We are very lucky to have the artwork done by Jim DeWitt and our own P/C Arvel Voss. There was a year that we had a contest and the winner was Kelly Phillips, daughter-inlaw of Bob and Peggy Phillips. We all have our favorite years. Mine being 1988. Commodore Pat Lane and myself dancing to the 'Your Momma Band' with Mare Island and the sailboats in the background, artwork done by P/C Voss. The only person I know that has all the t-shirts since 1986 is Ida Ann Tyer. Maybe one of these Friday 'happy hour' nights she could display them for us. Happy YRA weekend and don't forget to buy your t-shirts!"

Although Ida Ann Tyer is no longer with us, Margot MacKerrow now continues on with this tradition. Happy St. Patrick's Day and Easter!

Answer below.

The yacht ensign consists of a boat anchor enclosed within a wreath of 13 stars. The pattern first emerged in 1848 when Congress officially designated the design for use on non-commercial U.S. sailing vessels. Although the legislation for its use was eventually revoked, the use of the flag persisted throughout the late 19th and early 20th revoked, the use of the gas eventually 20th flown on private boats and yachts todown on private boats and yachts todown on private boats and yachts todown on private boats and dates day. 
