VYC Private Parties

Don't we all love having and attending parties??? It's been about two years when I ran into Karen Paedon (wife of P/C LF Bob Paedon) and I mentioned to her, if they had any stories of history,

I will write it. Her reply to me was, no I don't, just that we were married here at the clubhouse and our reception was also held here. This prompted me to go back in VYC The First 100 Years book to research the private parties of the past. This article will be written in five categories, weddings, anniversaries, birthdays, retirements, and other celebrations.

Weddings

Joe and Pat Schlosser were married at VYC on August 22, 1970; Fred Marble and June Hayden were married on March 19, 1971. Many members were present at their wedding reception at VYC after the ceremony. Dr. Don McCabe and Jean Hardy were married in the Crow's Nest at the clubhouse and left on their boat after the ceremony for a honeymoon; May 1977 P/C LF Bob and Karen Paedon were married at VYC with the reception also being here at the clubhouse; Ray and Lorraine LaVoie were married September 1986. The ship's bell behind the bar was a wedding present, and they donated it to the Club; same year Bob and Rosemary Hull were married and hosted a wedding celebration at the clubhouse on November 23rd; Ken Hall and Gail Lalley were married aboard Lady Hawk at the VYC guest dock on November 11, 1995. Photo on page 434 and the late P/C LF Bill and Anita Bird family have made weddings a family affair. Carolyn (Anita's sister) and Gene Crepps were married November 1982 with reception after the ceremony at the VYC clubhouse. Their son John and Sheila Bird were married November 1987 but only having their reception at VYC. The most recent wedding held at VYC was that of their grandson. Johnny Bird and Jessica Larke were married on April 6, 2013. This was the most elegant and elaborate wedding I've attended at VYC. The clubhouse was turned into a wonderland and held over 150 guests. This truly was a beautiful wedding. Should you need to know the wedding planner's name, let me know. There were other weddings held at VYC but I thought with respect I should leave them out, as their unions of marriage failed.

Anniversaries

George and Anna Van Dolson celebrated their 25th Wedding Anniversary at VYC on January 13, 1971. Also, in 1996 George and Anna celebrated their 50th Anniversary; Red and Frankie Fox celebrated their 52nd wedding anniversary in 1978 with a party at the Club; Past Commodore Chet Garrett and Anita celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on June 15, 1980; and Orrin and Gen French celebrated their 50th anniversary with a party at the Club on July 28, 1991.

<u>Birthdays</u>

The first birthday listed in our yearbook was the 80th birthday celebration of Mac McCaghren at the Club on May 7, 1971; Port Captain Arthur Campbell was a surprise guest of honor at the birthday party following the membership meeting on February 24, 1929; another party for Art was, "Call it what you will – A. Campbell Retirement/Birthday Party II Potluck - ACK Birthday Strikes Again Potluck -Art's Potluck revisited - it'll take place at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, February 24, 1983, preceding the General Membership Meeting; a champagne fountain, buffet and disco music by Precision Sound helped celebrate Helen Warren's 75th birthday at the clubhouse on October 9, 1983; Helen was surprised by a potluck luncheon to celebrate her 80th birthday in 1988; Carmen Batchelor's 70th birthday was celebrated at the Club on August 1986; Toni Borges celebrated her 50th birthday with a huge party at the Club in March 1995; also celebrating her 60th birthday in 2000 and her 69th birthday dinner in March 2014 here at VYC; Margot MacKerrow celebrated her 50th birthday at VYC in March 1998; Joe Schlosser's 85th birthday was celebrated with a surprise potluck on March 14. Toni Borges coordinated the event, and P/C Vern Coburn arranged to have a Dave Beronio sketch of Joe matted and signed by many of the members. The picture was later framed and is hanging in the bar. Retirements

A Just For Fun Party was held on December 16 to celebrate (belatedly) Martin Gabrielson's retirement from the Navy and his successful passing of the California State Bar exam. Mike Pretzer celebrated his retirement after 32 years of law enforcement with a party at the clubhouse on December 1994 and Ken Hall's retirement from United Airlines was celebrated with a party at the VYC in August 1997.

Other Celebrations

P/C Bill and Thelma Batchelor held an Open Boat party on July 18, 1982 for their Westsail 32 Kanska; Roger Clark had a boat warming for his Morgan 44 on October 9, 1988 and a Bon Voyage party was held for Bill and Carolyn Daly on August 9, 1992 who were moving to Florida.

The 2015-2016 race season has begun! Have you ever wanted to race? Ever wanted to join in the fun and see what it's all about? Our Wednesday night races are the place to be! Come on down and join us. Most skippers are frequently looking for permanent or occasional "fill-in" crew. Some sailing and/or racing experience is desirable but a strong desire to learn, a little natural aptitude, and a 6-pack can make up for any lack of experience. It beats working!

I want to start with an acknowledgement to Jim Wallis. As you race skippers may remember, I sent an email to all of you stating we were running very low on shotgun shells and asking for help in finding some. Jim went above and beyond and instead of giving advice, he purchased and donated shells to the Club. We now have enough for a few years of racing!

Another big thank you goes to Bill Schweitzer, who has built 3 new marks for us. The new marks will be used to replace the missing CM1, Oil Wharf, and Glen Cove marks. If you have some free time, I know Bill could use some help getting them set. Once the marks are deployed, our course sheets will be updated to include these marks. This should give us some variety in the races we run on Wednesday nights, as well as the North Bay Series on Saturdays. Copies of new course sheets, once available, will be posted to our website and a limited quantity will be available on our bulletin board.

As many of you already know, we've made a big change to the way we're scoring races this season. The introduction of Jibeset.net adds an internet based service that makes scoring easier and more consistent. Results are created in minutes now, usually in-hand before all the racers get to the clubhouse, and are posted online immediately. No more waiting! 




PICYA REPORT




