In Remembrance of Shirley Burns

Originally I had planned to write an article requested by Director Tom Ochs and decided to put it aside. Directors Tom Ochs and Bill Zerby went to visit Shirley. In speaking with her son, he informed them that Shirley was not doing well and she

was under Hospice care. A few days after their visit with sadness, Shirley Burns passed away. This article will be in her remembrance.

From the pages of Oar Power and Sail, our history book The First 100 Years written by P/C Doctor Tom Hosley and a short blurb written by Shirley, preparing for the YRA Race in 1978 will be of her remembrance.

"On December 16, 1976, Shirley Burns became the first paid manager of the Club, thus providing much needed daily operation responsibilities and services required by a business with a budget of \$116,000 per year. Shirley remained as manager for ten years, except for two breaks, and was replaced by Barbara Chandler in 1987."

"Commodore Tom Hosley wrote in his October 1977 Binnacle article under the heading Shirley is Launched:

'In case you haven't seen 'Shirley' lately, we have two Shirleys; one is our Club manager, Shirley Burns, and the other is the new VYC work vessel, Shirley. How many yacht club managers have a vessel built and named after them? Well, we do. They are both work horses... Shirley was designed and built by Shipmates Bill Bird, Gary Cicerello and Bob Luce with the able assistance of Ed Grafton, Jay Baron, Dick Jensen, Art Campbell, Ed Lane and Al Richardson. She will be used soon for the seawall repair project. Bill will be needing lots of help to

get the job done before winter. Sign up now for the work party and get a free ride on Shirley.' The work barge Shirley was christened on October 9. A real beauty, she measured 19½ feet long, 8½ feet wide, and weighed in at slightly under a ton. The christening was held at 3:30 in the afternoon, followed by a spaghetti feed prepared by Dick Jensen for \$2.50 at 4:30."

"Club Manager Shirley Burns described getting ready for the YRA Vallejo Race in a Binnacle article as follows:

'...the annual invasion of boats and crews from the entire Bay Area, which ranks right up there with the onslaughts on Normandy Beach, Inchon Harbor and the shores of Tripoli. Fortunately, very few shots are fired in anger...Being just slightly prepared for the event is like being a little bit pregnant. Either you are or you aren't... I've been assigned the big stuff – the garbage dumpsters, chemical toilets and the rent-a-cops. I've become the in-house (outhouse) procurer...Try to imagine hosting a party in your home and not knowing definitely how many guests will turn up for the event. We fly blind on numbers, with the vagaries of wind, tide and hangovers playing havoc with any projections. If we cook for 500, will only 200 turn up? That's a bunch of spaghetti sauce to live with, believe me."

Those of us who knew her will remember her in our own personal way. We will all miss her immensely and definitely will not forget her. She was one Classy Lady. Shirley died on March 17, 2016 on St. Patrick's Day. As requested, no services will be held. Our condolences to her family.

PICYA REPORT

The PICYA 2016 March Delegate's meeting was held at the Benicia Yacht Club on Monday, March 7th. VYC PICYA delegate Maggie Sabovich attended this meeting, earning the VYC four Club of the Year points.

PICYA's Annual Spring Leadership Conference was held at the Martinez Yacht Club on Sat. March 26th, 2016. A continental breakfast and lunch was served at \$25 per person. All new VYC Officers, Board Directors, bartenders and new members were urged to attend, plus this event provided the opportunity to earn as many as 15 Club of the Year points for the attendance of VYC Officers, Directors, and members. Topics and speakers included:

- San Francisco Yacht Racing Challenge Tom Ehman, CEO and Founder.
- In 2017, a fleet of turbo-charged 12- meter mono-hulls will compete on San Francisco Bay for \$500,000 in prize money in one design "Super 12's", with carbon fiber hulls and decks, modern rigs, and minimum electronics, placing emphasis on sailing skills and teamwork. The "Super 12's" will be built from the same female mold by the same builder, all rigging and deck hardware will be identical, and each team will use the same restricted sail inventories. Instrumentation is limited to just a handheld GPS, a VHF radio, a depth sounder, a compass and a Windex.

- How to win Club of the Year COTY Chair

Leadership Forum – "Birds of a Feather" meetings where all attendees discussed challenges their respective clubs are facing and how they are solving them.

PICYA'S 2016 "Opening Day on the Bay" is scheduled for Sunday, April 24th, and this year's theme is "Heroes on the San Francisco Bay", which may refer to Military Heroes, Historical Heroes, Bay Area Innovators, Inspirational Figures, Acts of Bravery on the Bay, fictional Super Heroes, Emergency Service Providers, etc. Since one of the early VYC members was revered author Jack London, he might be remembered as one of the early "Heroes" by VYC boats decorated to theme. VYC members can decorate their boats to this theme or with flags and streamers and participate in the parade to earn the VYC up to 50 Club of the Year points or can also bring

friends/family members along to view the water-front boat parade from the PICYA Committee Boat, which provides breakfast and lunch aboard a Horn-blower Yacht. Cost is \$80 for adults/\$40 for children 2-12 up to March 31st. After that date an additional charge of \$5 will be added. Information and registration forms about entering your boat in the deco-



rated boat parade or cruising along the San Francisco waterfront is on the PICYA website at www.picya.org. PICYA member clubs will also be donating prizes and/or money for the 16 winning boats in each category, so the VYC will be providing our usual t-shirts, hats and wine for the Opening Day Decorated Boat Parade Winner's Award Bags.

The PICYA Board of Directors held a brainstorming "retreat" in February at the Encinal YC and one of the new projects resulting from that gathering is a new online monthly PICYA newsletter called the "PICYA Navigator", which is designed to provide member yacht clubs with information about current PICYA and PICYA member club events. This newsletter will be emailed out on Tuesday mornings one week after each monthly PICYA Delegates' meeting, which will provide a week to gather information from the Delegates' meeting, plus information about upcoming events from our member clubs. Member clubs can email event information and invitations for their respective club events to PICYAnews@ gmail.com on the Friday following each Delegate's meeting. PICYA Rear Commodore Winston Bumpus (Sequoia YC) is the inaugural Editor of this new publication, which appeared for the first time on March 14, 2016.

The next PICYA Delegates Dinner meeting will be held at the Pittsburg Yacht Club on Monday, April 4th, 2016. PICYA Regional Affairs Issues: PICYA Regional

fairs Chair/VYC PICYA Delegate Maggie Sabovich has been working with a local Alameda organization called "SAWW", or "Save Alameda's Working Waterfront", since December 2015, in order to prevent a residential development of 500+ units at the historic Alameda Marina, which is the location of Svendsen's Boat Works, Boat Yard, Boat Transport, and Marine store, plus many other

marine service companies that provide multiple services to the Bay Area boating community. Svendsen's business is called "Pacific Shops" and it also oversees a 530 berth marina, a 700+ boat dry dock, and the only 3 ton crane in the Central Bay, plus a huge RV facility for boat owners. In addition, Alameda Marina houses the Island Yacht Club, along with 60 businesses employing 250 people. The "SAWW" Committee has been working with The City of Alameda City Council and City Staff, plus private citizens and boat owners to change the current zoning regulations, so that all of the current businesses can remain. Bay West Development, which bought into Pa-

cific Shops in 2006, wants all the businesses to be razed by next year to make room for this residential development, so we have a substantial challenge facing the Committee. Most recently 25 supporters in favor of keeping the Alameda Marina as it is, spoke before the Alameda City Council in support of favorable zoning changes, and waited until after 11 PM at the February meeting of the City Council to speak. More committee members are needed, so anyone interested in saving this historic marina is asked to contact Maggie mksabovich@yahoo.com.
