VYC Historian 2016–2017

Historical Notes From The Past



Recently I was given a number of old Vallejo Yacht Club Binnacles from Margot MacKerrow from her father's personal collection. Her father, P/C Horace MacKerrow, was Vallejo Yacht Club's Commodore in 1975. In reading through these historic Binnacles, I found the following article in the April 1990 Binnacle about the

renovation of the Club harbor written by Club Historian, Tom Hosley. I think you will find it interesting to read how the harbor was in the early 1950's, how through the years we have continued to renovate the harbor as we are currently doing so now.

"Did you know that Vallejo Yacht Club berths once extended north almost to the municipal marina? The photograph shows that berths for sailboats were way out along the walkway built just inside the row of U.S. Navy dolphins then used by the Navy to moor barges, gunnery targets and dredge pipes. This is the area that is now being dredged for the expansion of the Vallejo Municipal Marina.

The history of how and why this northern extension came about was told to me by P/C Arthur Krause recently while we were going over the scrapbook of his year (1952) as Commodore. Because of the lack of regular dredging and lack of a seawall around the berths, the harbor silted in to the extent that by 1946, boats could only get in and out at high tide. By the early 1950's the inside berths were totally useless and the outside row was available only at high tide. In order to provide any berthing for sailboats, the walkway and berths to the north were built as a temporary measure until the regular harbor could be dredged and a seawall constructed. Both Art Krause and Leroy Taylor recall having their sailboats moored in this new area. It was a long walk out to one's boat in those days. Krause related that at low tide the mud at the bottom of the harbor was three feet above the level of the water. That was not too much different than the level of mud south of the present work dock at low tide.

It was 1952, during Art Krause's term as Commodore, that work actually started on dredging the harbor. He relates that a lease from the City of Vallejo was proposed that would create both a berthing area south of the old clubhouse and north of the clubhouse extending 100 feet

further out into the deeper water and be a total of 1500 feet in length. The south area would include that of the old Virginia Street wharf and extended to Raahauge's ferry operation. He objected because of possible silting in of his waterfront and the City would not approve of the south extension. The decision was made to build a new berthing facility north of the clubhouse with three rows of berths in place of the single rows north and south of the clubhouse. After the necessary permits were obtained, a dredge was built and a pile driver purchased. Construction was started in 1952 with all volunteer member help. The job was not completed until 1956 when the seawall was completed. The temporary north berthing was demolished and the old berthing area south of the clubhouse abandoned. The Club still retains a lease on an area south of the work dock for future additional berthing."

PICYA REPORT



The April 3, 2017 PICYA meeting was held at the Pittsburg YC. VYC Delegate Maggie Sabovich, husband Roger Karlsrud, alternate VYC delegate Wendell Snyder and 100 other delegates attended. The next scheduled PICYA meeting, featuring Awards for Opening Day boat parade entrants, will be held at the Oyster Point YC on May 1.

The 100th Anniversary of PICYA's Opening Day on the Bay was held on Sunday, April 23rd, and Commodore Linda Blue had asked all member clubs to enter at least one boat from each respective club for this historic event. The theme this year was "Cruising the Century," which used themes from any nautical, historic, or scientific event from the period between 1917 and 2017. Every commodore from each PICYA member club was asked to cruise aboard the PICYA Hornblower Committee Boat to be present for the 100th Anniversary photograph, which was taken on-board. VYC Commodore Bob Lockhart was on-board the Hornblower Committee boat for this photograph. Maggie Sabovich and Wendell Snyder were also aboard representing the VYC, and were also responsible for all the table decorations for the fifty long tables provided for those eating breakfast and luncheon aboard.

At press time, we did not have a completed list of VYC boats participating in the Opening Day on the Bay boat parade, so these boats and their skippers will be listed in the June 2017 Binnacle. The parade featured over 100 historic workboats, fireboats, towboats, and classic and modern craft, all decorated to theme. Both power and sailboats competed for "best decorated" honors. This year's parade Grand Marshal is Lt. Colonel John Morrow of the US Army Corps of Engineers.

Each PICYA member club had been asked to contribute merchandise, wine or other nautical gift items worth at least \$250, which will be awarded to the 16 Decorated Boat Parade winning boat crew members at the May 1st Oyster Point YC Delegate meeting. Our Ship's Store contributed 8 shirts at \$20 each plus Maggie had 17 West Marine bags, valued at \$5.00 each, left from last year's GVR. Maggie also contributed 6 VYC shirts valued at \$20 each, plus two \$20 bottles of wine, all of which add-

ed up to a total of \$405, which placed the Vallejo YC in the "Bronze" contribution category for Opening Day on the Bay donations.

CALIFORNIA BOATERS CAN **NOW TAKE** FREE BOATING SAFETY COURSE AT HOME BoatUS Foundation online boating safety course approved by California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways. A new law says California boaters will need to go to school, and the BoatUS Foundation for Boating Safety has the right course to fit their schedule and budget. Starting January 1, 2018, Golden State boaters ages 20 or younger who operate a motorized vessel on state waterways will need to have a boater safety card showing successful completion of a boater safety education course. Each year thereafter on January 1, more age groups will be added to the requirement so that by 2025 all California boaters will need to carry a boater card issued by California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW).

The easiest and most affordable way to meet the requirement is to take the BoatUS Foundation's free online Boating Safety Course, now approved by DBW, which allows boaters to take the course in the comfort of their own home. Once successfully completed, the course does not expire so boaters of all ages don't need to delay and can complete their boating safety education now. "We've loaded the course with interactive animations, videos and photos to give boaters an education that goes well beyond the basics of boating," said BoatUS Foundation President Chris Edmonston. "The best part is that our course is free and can be taken at home. It's designed so that you can stop and continue at any time."

Upon finishing the course, boaters can print their own certificate of completion, and beginning in 2018, the state will begin to issue official California Boater Education Cards to students who have completed the course between January 1, 2015 and December 31, 2017. The course and exam is approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators and recognized by the US Coast Guard as exceeding the minimum requirements for the National Recreational Boating Safety Program. 
