VYC Historian 2016-2017

A Little Known Secret of Vallejo Yacht Club...



Have you ever wondered how the Prohibition times in 1921 impacted events at Vallejo Yacht Club? Well, there is a little known secret that occurred you might find interesting and definitely amusing. As you recall,

Prohibition was a time from 1920-1933 that did not allow the production, importation, transportation and sale of alcoholic beverages in the United States. Knowing that, how then did alcohol become 'the secret' at Vallejo Yacht Club?

In a front page October 31, 1921 Vallejo Evening Chronicle article, Police Judge Browne – Jack London's good friend and the same "Judge Ha Ha" who had suggested the Navy was being hypocritical in its antigambling stance - proposed a contract between the city and the Vallejo Yacht Club that would enable the Club to buy contraband booze seized in police raids. The liquor could be used to remove barnacles and old paint from boats, said Browne, an active yacht club member. "After endangering his olfactory organs this morning while determining that certain evidence in bottles was indeed 'likker', Judge Brown declared that the stuff would quickly remove barnacles and paint from copper bottoms of boats but would have to be removed quickly if the owners of the boats want to save the hulls," the article stated. The proposed

contract was just a joke, but the Yacht Club still had a way to get liquor without anyone noticing. Club member and longtime Vallejoan, Tom Ochs, says his father, Ralph Ochs, also a Yacht Club member, told him about a secret hatch in the Club, which during Prohibition was built on pilings over the water. The hatch, at the bottom of what appeared to be a janitor's closet in a bathroom, opened directly to the river. "When a boat with the hootch came in, that's where it would be pulled up," Ochs said. "And you could always tell when the stuff came in because some judge's car, or the mayor's car, or the police chief's car would be parked on the street in front of the Club."

Special thanks to Board of Director Tom Ochs and Brendan Riley (his father, Wyman Riley, served four consecutive terms as Board of Director, serving as Chairman from 1980-1982), who from their family archives, provided this fun and wonderful secret. In addition, this story was told to Tom Ochs by Joe Schlosser. Joe Schlosser was bartender of Vallejo Yacht Club during the time of Prohibition and is still the longest bartender to have served the Yacht Club. A picture of Joe can be seen on the back wall of the bar at the Club.

PICYA REPORT



The March PICYA meeting was held at the Benicia YC on March 6. VYC Delegate Maggie Sabovich, husband Roger Karlsrud, alternate VYC Delegate Wendell Snyder and 110 other delegates enjoyed a great salmon dinner. The next scheduled PICYA meeting will be held at the Pittsburg YC on April 3.

The PICYA Spring Leadership Conference was held on March

18 at the Martinez YC. Registration began at 8 AM with a Continental breakfast, and a chicken piccata luncheon served at noon. Fifty attendees enjoyed the program, which was packed with information about subjects of interest to every yacht club, and was organized and led by PICYA Rear Commodore Bill Gargan of the Sausalito Yacht Club. VYC Vice Commodore Rick Bastien represented the Vallejo Yacht Club, along with VYC PICYA Delegates Maggie Sabovich and Wendell Snyder.

The next major PICYA sponsored event will be PICYA's 100th Anniversary Opening Day on the Bay scheduled for Sunday, April 23 from 8:30 AM to 2:45 PM. The theme will be "Cruising the Century" celebrating Opening Days from 1917-2017, and the decorated boat parade theme can be from any event during that period, and may be nautical, scientific, historical, technological or from any event that has occurred during the past 100 years. To celebrate this historic event, PICYA invites the commodores from PICYA's 104 member yacht clubs to participate by appearing together on PICYA's Hornblower Committee Boat for an historic photograph to be taken while on board during the Opening Day Decorated Boat Parade, which will be passing by the committee boat. PICYA asks these commodores to appear in their official blue blazers and light or white pants for this photograph, which will forever mark this historic occasion.

To register for your cruise on the committee boat, or to register your boat to participate in the decorated boat parade, please go to www.picya.org, and click on the "registration" icon. The parade will feature over 100 historic workboats, fireboats, towboats, and classic and modern craft, all decorated to theme. Both power and sailboats will be competing for "best decorated" honors. Your boat and skipper must be registered in order to be considered for an award, and that has to be done at least a week ahead of the Opening Day event. This year's parade Grand Marshal

is Lt. Colonel John Morrow of the US Army Corps of Engineers. Each PICYA member club is asked to contribute their club's ship's store merchandise, wine, spirits or any other nautical gift items worth at least \$250, as these are the items that will be awarded to the 16 Decorated Boat Parade winning boat crew members. Some clubs also contribute gift baskets of their club merchandise which will be offered in an "opportunity drawing" onboard the Committee Boat.

The PICYA was founded in San Francisco on May 12, 1896 by five charter yacht clubs with Charles G. Yale of the San Francisco Yacht Club as its first President. This organization was formed in order to improve communication between yacht clubs, to provide uniform regional racing rules and to encourage yachting competition and activity. The five charter clubs and the years they were founded were: California Y.C. (1893), Corinthian Y.C. (1886), Encinal YC (1890), Pacific YC (1873) and the San Francisco YC (1869). South Bay YC, founded in 1888, joined PICYA in 1897.

RBOC (Recreational Boaters of California)

VYC PICYA Delegate Maggie Sabovich was appointed to be one of 16 RBOC Directors in January 2017. She attended the annual "Meet your Legislators" Day in Sacramento on March 28, along with 15 other RBOC Directors, when she met with State Senator Bill Dodd along with several other legislators in order to solicit their support of legislation that impacts the rights of boaters in California. Current issues being addressed by the RBOC Board of Directors are listed below:

- **1.** Boater fuel taxes should be used exclusively for boating programs and services.
- **2.** No viable alternative paints are ready yet as a substitute for copper-based anti-fouling paints.
- **3.** Boating under the influence should not be included on your DMV driving record.
- **4.** Actions to mitigate invasive plant species are ongoing by the Dept. of Boating and Waterways thanks to the lobbying efforts of RBOC.
- **5.** Take action today to protect your boat engine from the corrosive affects of higher ethanol gasoline by writing your California and national legislators. This higher ethanol content gas is being urged by the corn growers lobby in D.C.




